

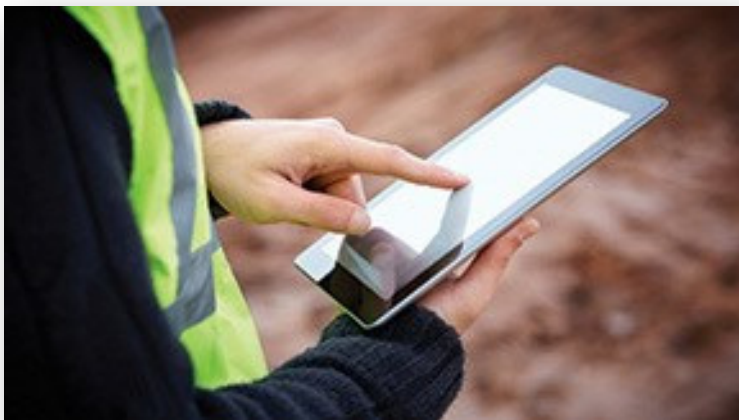
Become a Certified Fire Door Inspector

Once you have been awarded a DoorCheck Foundation Certificate in Fire Door Inspection (allows you to carry out inspections and reports for your company) you will be able to apply to become an Advanced Certificated DoorCheck Fire Door Inspector.

As an Advanced Certificated Inspector you will be able to work independently, provide inspection certification and carry out inspections of fire doors. This is an essential part of any fire risk assessment required by law to be done by a building's responsible person or agent. Once you have qualified as an Advanced Fire DoorCheck Inspector you will be able to benefit from:

In order to become an Advanced DoorCheck Inspector, you first have to successfully complete the DoorCheck Foundation Certification and pass the examination which we can facilitate at our training centre or at your work place (min 7 persons required in attendance).
